



End of Grant (EoG) Knowledge Translation

This is an online course designed to provide researchers, trainees and others with the knowledge and skills to design an end of grant KT plan.

To help you develop your EoG KT plan, the KT Program offers the *End of Grant Knowledge Translation (EoG KT)* course.

This fully online, self-directed course provides a flexible way for you to not only learn why and how to develop an effective KT plan for your grant application, but also provides the optional opportunity for you to receive feedback on your EoG KT plan from experts in the KT field.

Upon completion of the course participants will be able to:

- Develop an end of grant KT plan
- Develop an approach to help tell the story about your research using media and social media
- Assess impact of research using bibliometrics and altmetrics

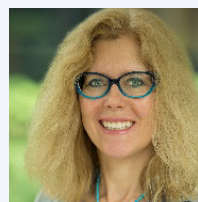

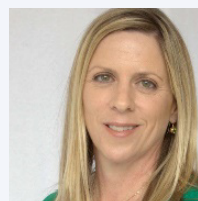
