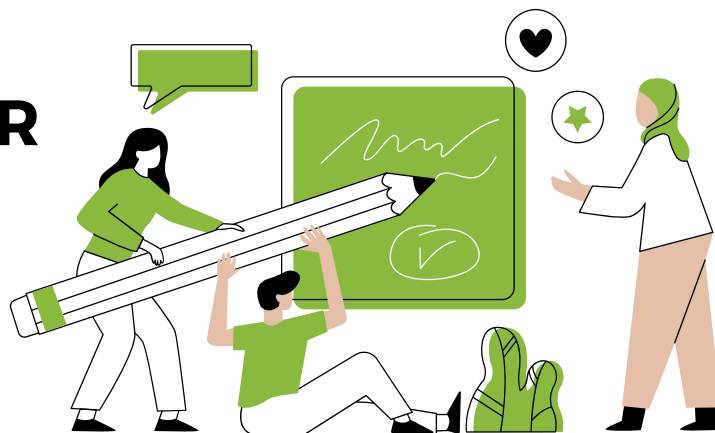


LOOKING TO TELL THE STORY OF YOUR RESEARCH?
